Our busy Autumn term has come to an end, the children have worked incredibly hard and are now ready for a well-earned rest!

Thank you so much for all of the kind gifts and cards we have received.

Some highlights from the term have been our dressing up day for Children in Need and we raised £185.64 which was fantastic. We donned our Christmas jumpers today and we've collected some much needed items for the local food bank. We raised £343.00 at our coffee morning in the Jubilee hall, the proceeds of which will go towards learning resources. We had a successful book fair selling £318 worth of books, so we are able to spend 25% commission on more books for classrooms.
