An online safety workshop was arranged and all parents were invited to find out about how to keep children safe when online.

We welcomed parents into school for a coffee and questions session where they could learn a little bit more about the teaching of English and Maths and how parents could help with these areas of learning at home. At the same time parents and other family members were able to join in our underwater diversity project entitled 'We are different....but we all swim together.' Our underwater display is now complete with all your wonderful
